NOTICE

[Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End-Semester Examinations: B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Semester I & II Students Only]

In pursuance of the University of Allahabad Regulations relating to Undergraduate Programmes of Studies for Four-Year Duration and Examinations [under the NEP-2020 Framework], as approved by the Academic Council (Resolution No. 03/49) in its meeting held on 26 August 2025 and subsequently ratified by the Executive Council in its meeting held on 4 September 2025, it is hereby notified that the following provisions shall govern the conduct of Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End-Semester Examinations for the concerned students.

In Major Subject (B.A./ B.Sc.) / Core Paper (B.Com.) / Minor Subject (B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com.), assessment shall consist of CIA and a Semester-End Examination, as prescribed in the approved scheme of examination. The CIA shall carry approximately 30% of the total marks. The credit details and marks distribution for Major, Minor, and Core courses for this Academic Year (Odd & Even Semesters) are specified in Annexure A (previously circulated by the Registrar, UoA Notification No. 05/R/670/2025 Dated 07.08.2025).

The CIA (only applicable to theory papers) shall be course-specific and continuous and may include one or more of the following modes of assessment: assignments, projects, class tests, presentations, or other approved methods by the UG Departmental Examination Committee, without disturbing the academic activities of other classes/sections/courses running in the department/centre.

It shall be the responsibility of the concerned teacher(s) to conduct the CIA, evaluate student performance, and award marks within the time stipulated in the Academic Calendar (Annexure B). In case more than one teacher is teaching a course, each teacher shall evaluate independently, and a weighted average shall be assigned. Prior communication of the chosen modes shall be made to the concerned students by the Dean/Head of Department by displaying the notice/announcement on the departmental notice board or through any other feasible method, with a copy forwarded to the Controller of Examinations. The modalities of such assessment

shall be recorded and all related documents shall be preserved by the respective Department/Centre. These records must be placed before any committee or team constituted by the University for verification purposes.

The Head of the Department shall submit the consolidated CIA marks to the Office of the Controller of Examinations within the respective semester. In general, no provision shall exist for altering or correcting the marks once the Office of the Controller of Examinations has received the consolidated CIA award sheet.

The End-Semester Examinations pattern, question paper structure, and duration (for the First Academic Year – Odd & Even Semesters) are specified in Annexure C.

Practical Examinations: There shall be no Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) in practical examinations. Odd Semester-Semester I: End-Semester Practical Examinations shall be conducted in the form of Viva Voce and/or Laboratory Assignments by the concerned course teacher and/or an internal examiner, as notified in the Academic Calendar. Even Semester-Semester II: End-Semester Practical Examinations, shall be conducted as Laboratory/Practical Examinations, as notified in the Academic Calendar and shall be conducted by the panel of examiners appointed by the Dean of the Faculty/ BoBS on the recommendation of the Head of the Department/Coordinator of the Centre. The appointed panel shall conduct the practical examination in question.
